

# Twelfth Grade CEP Summer Reading Assignment

## Directions

The first 12th grade unit is Writing the Personal Narrative for College. Your summer reading is to choose **two age appropriate memoirs**. If you are struggling to find books, we have provided lists of suggestions for you (see link on Ms. Barbour's Website). You are not required to choose either book from the lists, but you may if you like. If you choose books not included on the lists, they must reflect the genre of memoirs and you must have your teacher's approval. With your teacher, complete the approval form on the back of this page. Hold on to the approval form to turn into Ms. Barbour, along with your work, in September. **ALL SUMMER READING WORK IS DUE ON THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS.**

1. For each book, complete the charts below.
2. Choose **8-10 significant** events in the story. Explain the protagonist's reaction to each event. Then, explain what his/her reaction to each event reveals about his/her identity. Lastly, choose a quote that demonstrates the effect each event has on the character (cite page numbers) and explain the quote's significance.
3. Identify **3-5** characters and their roles in the significant events. Explain the impact of the event on these characters and support with details from the book.
4. Be prepared to turn in your charts to your 12<sup>th</sup> Grade English teacher in September.
